SCHOOL AND FAMILY COMMITMENT

Tri-Cities Christian Schools maintains a non-discriminatory policy based on race, color, and national origin in the administration of its admission and educational policies. In order to be accepted for admission into TCCS, parents and students must agree with and support the moral and ethical standard and philosophy upon which the school is founded. The parents and school must work together in mutual support of their desire to supply each student the opportunity to grow and become all that God intends him/her to become.

An independent, quality, Christian education is a lifetime family investment. To enable an education at Tri-Cities Christian Schools to be affordable, tuition payment options are available. It is the desire of TCCS to enroll families who value a Christian education, agree with the philosophy, practice good stewardship of their finances, and support the program of excellence through commitment of time and prayer.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The responsibility of the Board of Directors is to ensure the TCCS founding vision still lives, and will continue to live, within Tri-Cities Christian Schools. The board is responsible for overseeing the direction of the school by setting policies. The administrator is responsible for implementing policies and the daily operation of the school.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The TCCS academic program is designed for the average and the above average student to prepare them for college and for leadership roles in their Christian life.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Tri-Cities Christian Schools is to provide the family with a Christ-centered, biblically-directed education that instills the vision and practice of excellence in academics, character, co-curricular activities and service to others.

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES

JUNIOR EAGLET & GRADES K5—12

Step 1: An appointment with the principal is required of all student(s) and parent(s) who seek enrollment at TCCS. This interview will provide the opportunity for the parent(s) and student(s) to become acquainted with TCCS, to clarify the academic placement of the student(s) and to determine the family's desire for a Christian education. Acceptance to TCCS is based on the interview, test scores, and previous school records.

Step 2: Once the above criteria has been met, the parents complete the registration form, tender the required fees and either personally return the forms to the principal or mail the forms and the required fees to the admissions office. Parents will be notified of the student's acceptance after the interview and all enrollment forms have been received.

Enrollment information may be requested from the Tri-Cities Christian Schools' Blountville office.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Bus service is provided to students from designated areas in the community on a limited basis for a monthly fee of **\$50/family**. Door to door bus service is not available.

EXTENDED SCHOOL CARE

Extended School Care (ESC) is provided at the Blountville Campus from the end of the school day until 6:00 p.m. The monthly fee of \$60 per student must be paid by the first of each month. The ESC fee for the Junior Eaglet is included in their tuition. ESC will not be provided at the Blountville Campus when school is closed due to inclement weather, early dismissals, holidays, or other designated days.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Tuition and fees are the major source of income for Tri-Cities Christian Schools, a non-profit corporation. In order for TCCS to maintain financial stability, it is essential that families meet payment deadlines. Payment of tuition and fees allows the school to strengthen programs, to increase faculty compensation and to operate with fiscal responsibility. Students are admitted with the understanding that the enrollment/re-enrollment contract is for the entire school year or from the time of enrollment until the end of the school year. TCCS may, in its sole discretion, adjust the amount owed in the event of an emergency, such as catastrophic illness, employment transfer from the greater Tri-Cities area, suspension or dismissal of a student by the school, or other reasons deemed acceptable by the school. **The following terms will apply to early withdrawal: withdrawal before June 1, one months tuition; withdrawal from June 1 to August 1, three months tuition plus book fees; withdrawal after August 1, 30% of the remaining tuition owed plus book fees. Except for the terms and conditions stated above, reductions in tuition cannot be made for absences, voluntary or involuntary withdrawal, or expulsion.**

- Tuition and fees are due and payable before students can attend class.
- Students will not be allowed to continue attending academic classes unless tuition is paid by stated deadlines.
- All accounts must be paid before academic records can be released to other schools or to colleges.
- A \$35 fee will be charged for all returned checks.
- TCCS, at its discretion, reserves the right to dismiss any student who does not follow the guidelines set forth by the school without refunding tuition or fees.

PAYMENT PLANS

TCCS uses FACTS Management to collect tuition for grades Junior Eaglet -12. In May, FACTS will mail an invoice to parents detailing total tuition for the school year and any discounts received. With the invoice, there will be instructions to enable parents to establish an online account including selection of either EFT or Credit Card as their method of payment and selection of payment dates (either the fifth or the twentieth of the month). Parents that pay their tuition in full by July 1 will receive a 5% discount.
